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Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) News

This year, Gladstone Public School has a few changes with some of our classroom and playground expectations and organisation. It may all seem like a lot but our students have adapted to our new systems very quickly and are so ready for it all to carry on during the year.

Behaviour Tracking

Both classes have introduced the same classroom behaviour tracking systems. You may have heard the students referring to them as "peg charts". Using these charts, teachers and students can work together to reward and correct behaviour during the day. All students start on the "ready to learn" section.

If a student displays a behaviour learning error, students are first given a verbal warning. This is followed by their peg moving to the "think about it" level if the learning error continues or a different error is shown. The next level is an in-class timeout where the student is given the opportunity to have some time away from the class while still inside the classroom to think about their behaviour and how they can change it. If another, or the same, behaviour learning error is shown, the student will attend the buddy class (the opposite classroom). If this occurs, you, as their parents or caregivers, will be contacted. This will mean that the student has displayed a behaviour learning error four times and been given three chances to become aware of their behaviour and the opportunity to change it.

We, as a school community, need to work together to create a network for our students where learning errors are discussed and corrected.

We also track positive behaviour. If a student is displaying a behaviour learning success they move to the "I am... making wise choices" level. If that behaviour success or a different one is shown, they move to the "I am...flying high" level. On this level students can be rewarded with as many "lucky" tickets as possible to go into the fortnightly draw. (Dawn at our assemblies)

Merit Levels

Every student now has a reward chart in our classes. If they make it to the "I am...flying high" level of the behaviour tracking chart then they will receive a sticker on their chart at the end of the day.

Once their chart has been filled they have made it to the Bronze Level and will receive their Bronze award at assembly. Notes will be sent home notifying parents when this happen.

Our Merit Levels are as follows:

- Bronze
- Silver
- Gold
- Platinum
- Principal's Award

Our students are very excited about the special rewards and treat days that will come with them attaining each level by the end of term.
